Concept Statement

This exhibition proposal considers the theme of cultural fabrication from the meanings and practices that characterize Hong Kong's self-made urban vernacular, in particular focusing on the dense urban fabric of the Graham Street market precinct in Central that has evolved over many decades.

Our interest is twofold. First, we are inspired by the existing textures and community character as manifestations of an incremental cultural process as well as concerned at their disjuncture with the increasing instrumentality of urban change as the legacy of Hong Kong's modernity. Second. We intend to make sense of the ongoing situation through a creative "architecture" of re-/inter-/trans-actions so as to contribute to the germinating force in the constitution of Hong Kong culture as a whole.

Corresponding to Hong Kong's urban context as a hyper-realistic metropolitan texture imbricated onto an extremely localized labyrinth, our proposal comprises a triple presence in the city.



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
Drawing from Graham Street market precinct's abundantly humane social as well as physical (infra)structures, **graham**'super will embody the continuous adaptations and reshufflings of micro-cultural processes via various media, from sensual and spatial to digital. As such, our networked exhibition installations exploit contemporary urban experiential opportunities to explore potentials for engendering a sensible "architecture" (as arche-techne or "originary-crafting of collective space) of change-in-continuity.








Alok, a self-taught guitarist and bassist, formed his first band Pillow early in 1996. After they disbanded in mid 98, he formed Slow Tech Riddim with the drummer of Pillow, when they started combining electronic music with live instruments. Together they had published two albums and contributed in numerous compilation releases. Since 2001, Alok appeared as a solo artist. He published the first 3" mini album <OK Karaoke> with The Pancakes in 2001. In 2002, he set up his own record label Lona Records, and started working as a producer. From the end of 2002 to 2009, he released five albums and a few 3" cd singles: <Wahoo!>, <31 Minutes to Midnight>, <29 Minutes from the End>, <All the Colors of the Dark>, <Stalemate>, < Amidst The Boredom, They Gather Forces>, <C For Schubert>, <Mass For Repose Of The Soul Of The Dead>, <Placid Places> and the coming single <MSN warning>.
